

Provisional warrant of arrest under s. 4(1) Backing of Warrants (Republic of Ireland) Act 1965

(Criminal Procedure Rules, r 17.11(1))

In the [county of . Petty Sessional Division of].

To each and all of the constables of .

C.D. a constable of has stated on oath that he has reason to believe that a warrant has been issued by a judicial authority in the Republic of Ireland for the arrest of A.B. (hereinafter called the defendant) who is accused [or convicted] of an indictable offence against the laws of the Republic but that the warrant is not yet in his possession; [and that he has reason to believe that the requirements of section 1(3) of the Backing of Warrants (Republic of Ireland) Act 1965 (surrender of convicted person for sentence or imprisonment) are satisfied;] and that he has received a request made on grounds of urgency by a member of the police force of the Republic holding the rank of inspector or above for the issue in the United Kingdom of a warrant for the defendant s arrest; and that he has reason to believe that the defendant is within the [county] aforesaid;

You are hereby commanded to arrest the defendant within five days after the issue of this warrant and to bring him as soon as practicable before a magistrates court.
