Tier II and Tier III Registration Process Transforming Rehabilitation Programme Ministry of Justice

OVERVIEW

There are a number of roles that potential providers may fulfil within the supply chain for the Rehabilitation Programme contracts. We have defined these roles as Tier I, Tier II and Tier III. Tier I potential pro viders will contract dire ctly with the Ministry o f Justice (M oJ) and should bid in accordance with the competition process. Tier II and Tier III potential providers are those who would form part of the supply chain via sub-contracts for the services und er the Reh abilitation P rogramme c ontracts or through the award of grant funding arrangements both with Tier I providers. We are running this registration process to enable visibility to Tier I potential pro viders of the range and diversity of Tier II and Tier III potential providers.

This document outlines the Tier II and Tier III registration process which MoJ is adopting in relation to Tier II and Tier III potential providers who are interested participating in the supply chain to deliver services under the Rehabilitation Programme. Tier II and Tier III potential providers should ensure that they ha ve carefully read and understood the below information prior to completing their registration form.

The information contain ed in this d ocument is specifically addressed to Tier II and Tier III potential pr oviders. It will be run in parallel to the Tier I competition and its related documents, but it does not form part of the competition.

The sections included within this document are:

- 1. **Purpose**: briefly outline s the purpo se of the Rehabilitation Programme's Tier II and Tier III registration process.
- 2. **What is submitted**: summarises what is required from Tier II and Tier III potential providers when submitting a registration form
- 3. **Where is it used**: sets out when the MoJ intends to use the information supplied by Tier II and Tier III potential providers and how this relates to the Tier I competition.
- 4. **Important information**: summarises relevant important facts to be considered by Tier II and Tier III pote ntial providers registerin g, including important limitations on this process.

It should be noted, for the avoidance of doubt , that the MoJ are not running a separate competition process for Tier II and Tier III potential providers. <u>No contracts will be directly awarded to any Tier II or Tier III potential providers throug h this regist ration process.</u> Any contracts awarded will be a matter for Tier I providers.

Furthermore, the Registration Process for Tier II and Tier III potential providers is voluntary. Use of the registration database or entry into a contract with any organisation on the registration database is optional for Tier I potential providers.

1. PURPOSE

- MoJ has planned the registration process in order to maximise, as far as is possible, the opportunities for Tier II and Ti er III potential providers to be involved in the Rehabilitation Programme and its resultant supply chain.
- The intention is to creat e a database of Tier II a nd Tier III p otential providers setting out the services they provide and the geogr aphical spread of those services. This data will be shared with Tier I potential providers following the Pre-Qualification Questionnaire (PQQ) phase of the Tier I competition.
- It is expect ed that bid ders will en gage with Tier II and Tier III potential providers during the remainder of the Tier I competition to finalise their supply chain proposals.
- Please not e that the registration process is a separ ate process to the Prior Information Notice registration process previou sly completed by intere sted potential providers. Any pote ntial providers who previously submitted information will therefore need to submit the new re gistration form to be included on the Tier II and Tier III registration database.
- Tier I poten tial providers will be precluded from entering i nto exclusivity deals wit h any Tier II or Tier III potential providers that are registered via this process.
- It is intend ed that Tie r I potential providers will be required to use an Indust ry Standard Partnering Agreement ("ISPA") when entering into contracts with any Tier II or Tier III potential provider to subcontra ct any of the services under t he Rehabilitation Programme. The MoJ is curren tly developing this industry standard agreement.

2. WHAT IS SUBMITTED

MoJ are a sking Tier II and Tier III potential providers to supply details about their organisation, their geographic focus and their capabilities.

Those potential providers who responded to the Prior Information Notice registration process will find that many of the fields spe cified are similar, however additional field s have been added for this registration process.

Information required within the online form includes:

- Name of o rganisation with contact infor mation, address and details of key individuals;
- Services that are currently provid ed in the sphere of offender man agement and rehabilitation;
- Location of current service provision;
- Comments on any existing plans for expansion; and
- Consent for the information submitted in the registration process to be shared.

3. WHERE IS IT USED

MoJ intends to use the information submitted via the registration process throughout the procurement process to support Tier I potential providers in establishing the most effective supply chain possible.

Tier I potential providers will have access to this data via the Tier I competition data room. It is our intention to allow Tier II and Tier III potential providers to have access to the database via the MoJ website, subject to Data Protection Act controls. Our aim is to provide the best opportunity for a broad range of providers to form cohesive and workable supply chains.

Tier I potential providers will be exp ected to contact registered Tier II a nd Tier III p otential providers directly where they wish to explore opportunities for inclusion within their proposed supply chain.

The MoJ will not continue to keep this database available following conclusion of the Tier I competition.

4. IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Whilst the registration process has been designed with the express purpose of widening the opportunities for Tier II and III potential providers, it should be recognised that the process has limitations.

In particular, potential providers should ensure that they understand that:

- MoJ will not be promoting or warranting the performance of Tier II and Tier II I potential providers registering through this process. Organisations looking to partner with those potential providers which they have identifie d through the registration process should therefore conduct their own due diligence as appropriate; and
- The submission of a re gistration form to the MoJ or inclusion on the registration database does not guarantee any Tier II or Tier III potential providers any contract for delivery of services or any minimum volu me or income. It will remain the sole responsibility of any Tier I, Tier II or Tier III po tential provider to create p artnerships and market their services to potential partners.
